The 8th Annual State Speech and Debate Tournament was held in Visalia, California, the first weekend of May. The winners from our Regional Tournament in March advanced to the State competition. Students from Oxnard and Hueneme competed in the English or Spanish categories for debate and prepared speeches. The debate structure and procedures require that students prepare for both the affirmative and negative positions, cross-examination and rebuttal responses, and that students are familiar with the expected procedures of competitive debate. Students are also expected to utilize evidence and research-based information in their

speeches and arguments and have well-developed skills in reading, writing and oral expression. Well-developed skills in organizing materials and the significance of good delivery is expected in both Speech and Debate. It is essential that students develop the competencies required for these activities which are collaboration, communication, critical thinking and teamwork. High School Debate Topic – Solitary confinement is a violation of human rights and should be banned. High School Prepared Speech Topics: Range from the benefits of a college education to lack of health care is a bigger threat to national security than terrorism.

11. STAFF REPORTS
A. School Safety

Staff reported on current safety practices and procedures as well as areas of strength and areas for growth in the Districts safe school plans, programs, and services.

Trustees expressed concerns about emergency supplies, toiletry services, water and food availability in each classroom in case a long term lockdown situation occurs, telephones in each classroom, policy for guest check-in at school sites, PBIS reporting procedures, Parent Square communications and student discipline trainings. Trustees thanked staff for the work done on this report.

B. 2018-19 Budget and LCAP Development

The Governor of the State of California and the State Legislature passed the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) to address historical state funding inequities that resulted in fewer resources for low-income students, English learners and foster youth. Under LCFF, each Local Education Agency(LEA) must adopt a Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) that includes goals, actions, and expenditures that meet the LCFF eight state priorities. In addition, the LEA must engage parents, students, educators, and community members while drafting their LCAPs. District Administration provided a report to Trustees that provided information on the District's Budget Development and Local Control Accounting Plan processes. On June 6, 2018, the District will hold public hearings on both the 2018-19 Proposed Budget and the 2018-19 Proposed Local Control Accountability Plan. Subsequently, the Board of Trustees will formally adopt the 2018-19 Budget and 2018-19 Local Control Accountability Plan at its meeting on June 20, 2018.

Trustees clarified what the current amount is per ADA and what the expected amount will be in 2018-19 school year.

C. Oxnard Middle College High School

Oxnard Union High School District strives to provide opportunities for students to succeed. Oxnard Middle College High School (OMCHS) is a new District school committed to providing all students a college experience with support to achieve both the High School Diploma and an AA/AS for transfer degree. OMCHS will welcome its first class of 9th grade students this August 20, 2018. OMCHS will open with at least 35 students but no more than 50 students the first year. Students at the Middle College will enjoy a small and supportive school environment. OMCHS students will dual enroll at Oxnard Community College. College classes successfully completed by students will receive high school and college credit.

Trustees asked if OMCHS is open to 9th grade students or all grades. Ms. Hernandez replied that it is for 9th grade students. Trustees asked if the AVID teachers will receive proper training. Ms. Hernandez replied that teachers will attend the August 2018 AVID training. Trustees asked if the students can participate in their home school athletic programs and Ms. Hernandez affirmed this. Dr. DeLeon thanked Ms. Hernandez for all of the work she has done.
