E. Approval of Amendment 1 to HMC Architects Agreement to Add Design Services for Offsite Improvements at New Camarillo Academy High School

F. Adoption of 2013 2014 School Calendar It is the recommendation of District Administration that the Board of Trustees adopt the 2013-2014 School Calendar, as presented.

This item was pulled and will be brought back at a future meeting.

#### 17. STUDY SESSION

Mr. Dickinson presented a report on the Governor's Budget Proposal and the District's budget preliminary estimates; other topics discussed were how to increase revenue such as possibly charging a transportation fee and by ensuring that the Food Services process is working well; a repayment plan for \$6.7m to Measure H; revising Board Policy language on reserves; and implementation of the Site Control Funding Formula by sites. He reported it was good news that Prop 30 passed and there will be no expected cuts and that this is the first time in five years that education funding has improved.

Highlights of the presentation:

- For the first time in five years educational funding has gone up.
- Funding is still about 10% less than the amount received in 2007-08
- Deficit factor is still more than 20% because of past cuts and unpaid cost-of-living adjustments.

- Increased funding for K-12 education is dependent upon a continued improved economy in the state and nation.
- A seven-year phase-in is contingent upon the Governor's Plan; increasing by 10% each year.
- Restoring cuts made to programs are not necessary; recovery give you the
  opportunity to design a better education plan and redesign the delivery model needed
  for tomorrow.
- A graph showing how the LCFF will be implemented was presented; the LCFF would replace revenue limits and most categorical program funding; and phased-in over seven years completed in 2020-21.
- The Governor proposes shifting responsibility for Adult Education programs from K-12 school agencies to community colleges effective 2013-14; community colleges are "encouraged to leverage the capacity and expertise currently available at K-12 district adult schools"; and the Governor also proposed broad expansion of online education programs.

Mr. Dickinson presented LCFF vs Revenue Limit estimates for 2013-14 at 14,845 ADA: the target LCFF base total is \$151m and the Revenue Limit base total is \$106.9m. The Phase-In of LCFF for the first year, at 10.23 percent for 2013-14, is \$4.5m for an estimated 2013-14 funding of \$111.4m.

Mr. Dickinson presented ideas for generating additional review such as the possibility of charging a transportation fee that could generate approximately \$87,500 per year; offering higher level, higher quality food, extending the Nutrition Break, and ensuring that the Free/Reduced Lunch meal process is working well.

Mr. Dickson presented a repayment plan for Measure H funds to be paid back yearly. The exact amount is yet to be determined but cost is estimated at \$6.7m.

A chart of historic and projected reserves from 2007-2008 through 2014-2015 was presented.

In closing, Mr. Dickinson stated the next step is to begin a draft of the 2013-2014 Budget for adoption in June.

# 13. BOARD MEMBERS' REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Trustee Davis reported attending two very worthwhile events, the WASC reception and the Camarillo Chamber breakfast that was hosted by OUHSD, and he thanked Dr. Soumakian for doing a very nice, succinct presentation on the funding and challenges we face, which was well-received by the audience.

Trustee Hall reported attending the WASC reception at ACHS and said the school looks beautiful.

Board President Edmonds reported attending the WASC reception at ACHS and he and Dr. Soumakian participated in a tour of ACHS with two Camarillo city council members.

Trustee Davis suggested to staff that Condor High School be included in the School Safety Plans and asked that the district be sensitive to treating Condor High School as a school and not a program; this will help ensure that the WASC visiting team sees Condor as a school and not a program. He requested that an update and progress report be provided regarding the district's Transportation Academy.
