Inouye Family Science Fair Award – Hueneme High School – Corene Duarte Mr. Nathan Inouye, in honor of his grandfather, presented RMHS Science Fair monetary awards to RMHS students, Camryn Morey and Sophia Esherick and a plaque to RMHS. Mr. Mark Contreras, RMHS Principal, introduced Dr. Rano Sidhu, RMHS Teacher, who introduced Camryn and Sophia along with their project. Sticky Rice: The Secret to Ancient Chinese Construction

Camryn and Sophia worked very diligently, listened to feedback, researched and performed the experiment. After receiving feedback on the data and results, they revisited their experimental design and repeated the experiment, collecting quantitative data. It was a growing experience for them, and both are preparing for the individual experiments for the 2020 Science Fair in February. Both girls are enrolled in IB Chemistry Higher Level.

Dick Jaquez, former OUHSD Teacher and Board Member, spoke on the OUHSD By-Trustee Area Election and Retiree Medical Benefits. Due to lack of time, it was decided that Dr. Davis, Mr. Weinstein and Mr. Jaquez will meet at a later time to discuss Mr. Jaquez's concerns.

Dr. Maria Elena Cruz, Director of the Oxnard LULAC National Education Service Center, spoke on behalf of the Upward Bound and newly formed CI STEM Programs. She recognized some of her students, parents, Coordinator, Arlene Morales and Assistant Andrea Zamora. Dr. Cruz expressed her deep appreciation for the support and assistance the District has provided the program for the last two years. She specifically thanked Dr. DeLeon and her team, Dr. Senesac, Mr. Ortiz, Dr. McCoy, Guadalupe Reyes, Roger Adams, Shannon Houston Scott and the CIHS staff and looks forward to the continued partnership with the District.

Several Upward Bound Program students spoke in favor of the program, what they've learned through the program and expressed their gratitude to the Board and staff for their support. Trustees thanked the students for their hard work.

Mr. David Maron, Ventura County Civic Alliance representative, shared the Civic Alliance annual report along with some key highlights.

10. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. DeLeon explained the selection of the Citizen's Advisory Committee to name Oxnard High School #8. She reviewed the timeline and the process. She noted the deadline for applying is Monday, September 30, 2019. The community is encouraged to apply online. The first Citizen's Advisory Committee meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 30, 2019.

Dr. DeLeon reminded everyone that OUHSD Trustees passed a resolution to transition to By-Trustee Area election as per the California Voting Rights Act which will take place during the 2022 election. The purpose of waiting for the 2022 election is to allow time to receive the results of the 2020 census report.

Anthony provided his report for the time period since the last board meeting on August 28, 2019. Anthony was asked at the August 28, 2019 if he could find out if Trustees missed anything over the summer. He replied that he couldn't find anything that was missed. He was also asked to poll students about their first impression of the Chromebook He replied that a lot of students are enjoying them and overheard one students state that she is able to work on her application for college now that she has the Chromebook. He mentioned that students aren't aware that they have the opportunity to receive a hotspot and stated it might be of use to students if can be announced. Trustee Hall asked Anthony what a school district can do to help deter students from vaping. Anthony replied that he felt it was best to educate students, inform them of the consequences are and make them aware of what resources they have available to them. Dr. McCoy added that Ms. Carrie Wolfe wrote a new grant, as part of the existing TUPE grant, that is specific to vaping education. He also added that student programming will come through Oxnard District Council, ODC, and each member will take back information to their specific school on how to promote the prevention and how to provide assistance to students; the Student Intervention Specialist will also take part in this. Dr. DeLeon asked Anthony if students are aware of lung infections through vaping. Anthony replied that he felt social media is helping students to be aware of this.

• Transportation Fleet

President Davis asked Mr. Weinstein for clarification of what Trustees are approving. Mr. Weinstein replied the resolution allows the District to engage the bond counsel as well as allow bond representatives to bring a sales agreement back to the Board for final approval. Trustee Hall asked if the actual refinancing will be brought to Trustees for approval. Mr. Weinstein replied that it will be brought back to the September 25, 2019 meeting. Trustee Hall also asked if the terms will be extended and expressed his desire that they not be. Mr. Weinstein replied that they will not.

This item was heard after item 8, Recognition.

Trustee Edmonds expressed his concern about Special Education interns with a provisional status and teachers being hired to be coaches. He feels that Special Education has a different standard when it comes to hiring of teachers for this area. Trustee Herrera asked Dr. DeLeon how she will follow-up on Trustee Edmonds' concerns. Dr. DeLeon replied that she will send out a report on how many new teachers are coaching and participating in extracurricular clubs. Dr. DeLeon informed the process of what is done to hire new Special Education teachers and noted the District has just completed another program with California Lutheran University that will assist the District in finding teachers with the same cultural backgrounds as our students. She would also like to increase and promote secondary education within the District academies.

Over the past two decades OUHSD Transportation Department and fleet has grown significantly to meet the needs of the District. The Transportation Department manages vehicles throughout the District that are assigned to various school sites and Departments along with its daily commitments for home to school transportation. Mr. Joshua Koenig-Brown updated the Board of Trustees about the current vehicle fleet and scope of responsibility of the transportation department.

Trustees inquired as to which vehicles are kept at school sites. Mr. Koenig-Brown replied that vans are usually kept at the sites. Dr. DeLeon asked if vehicles have been purchased through the CTEIG grant and if so, are these vehicles allowed to be used by other CTE programs offered in the District. Dr. McCoy affirmed this. Trustee Herrera asked how liability is covered for passengers traveling in vehicles. Mr. Koenig-Brown replied that the individual user is required to complete a form upon a physical visit to the transportation office. The driver is required to participate in an employee pull notice program; a DMV program where the driving record is submitted to the District which proves the driver to have a valid driver's license and be a safe driver in the State of California. Dr. DeLeon inquired about grants available for electronic buses; are there multiple grants available each year. Mr. Koenig-Brown replied that he is not aware of any grants available that the District has not yet applied for. Dr. DeLeon asked if there is a State guideline on mileage capacity per vehicle. Mr. Weinstein replied that he isn't

aware of a State guideline but there is a guideline from our JPA, insurance company, on the age of the vehicle.

• Update on the Raptor System

Raptor is an entry management security system designed to detect potential threats to students and staff through instant background checks. Today, Raptor is trusted to protect over 25,000 K-12 schools across our nation and Raptor continues to develop innovative, integrated school safety technologies. Since its inception, Raptor has identified and alerted officials to more than 50,000 sex offenders attempting to enter school properties and has issued over 250,000 custody alerts. The Raptor system has also been credited with the arrests of numerous absconded sex offenders that have crossed state lines. OUHSD will be installing the Raptor system at RMHS with the plan to add to each school when their lobby security renovation has been completed.

Trustees confirmed the main use of this system is to track sex offenders. Mr. Koenig-Brown affirmed that it scans the sex offender data base and added that other alerts can be added to the data base as well. Dr. DeLeon informed Trustees that visitors to District campuses that interact with students on a regular basis should be fingerprinted. Trustee Sher expressed her appreciation of the system. Trustees inquired if a visitor can still enter a campus without a photo ID. Mr. Koenig-Brown replied that they are permitted, granted the correct information is entered to acquire a visitors pass. Trustees inquired about family members that are not on a student's emergency card; can they be allowed to pick up students. Mr. Koenig-Brown affirmed that they can with proper ID.
